From the pastor...

"He is risen!" The traditional response to this is, "He is risen, indeed!"

This has been a common form of greeting among followers of Jesus. It must not be for us some empty tradition, mere words we recite. "He is risen!" These words remind us of the joyous news we celebrate at Easter.

In Luke's Gospel we read of women going to the tomb. They found that the stone had been rolled away from the tomb. They went into the tomb. They discovered that the body of Jesus was not there. They were confused. Two men in clothing that glowed stood beside them. The women were frightened. The men said, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here; he has risen!"

"He is risen!"

We respond with. "He is risen, indeed!" In this way, we who follow Jesus are sharing this fantastic news and truth with one another. And we share it with others. There are many today who are frightened. There are some who seem to have little hope. The resurrection of Jesus is what gives us hope in this world. The resurrection of Jesus reminds us that we will be just fine.

Let our witness be, "He is risen! He is risen, indeed!"

"I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me, even though they die, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?" (John 11:25-26)

HELP Health Equipment Lending Program

Do you or someone you know need temporary medical equipment?

HELP began in 2010 with the idea of three men from the community (two from Trinity Lutheran Church and one from First UMC) who saw the need for health equipment to be available to all who may have need of it.

HELP offers used medical equipment to anyone with a temporary need. The equipment can be "borrowed" for up to six months, but can be extended with a phone call for a maximum borrow time of one year. The equipment is housed at First UMC.

The equipment is donated by individuals and health care providers. It is cleaned and sanitized before being issued for use.

Adult Ministry and Worship-Pastor: Pastor Dan reported that the book of Revelations has now been completed. The study of Revelations was well attended by several people. Pastor Dan's final comment was that after studying the book of Revelations the consensus is: "Jesus is coming back". The book of Hebrews will be the next adult ministry topic. Pastor Dan announced that no Adult Ministry class during the Holy Week. Pastor Dan indicated that he has 2 upcoming baptisms in April.

Children's Ministry: Pastor Dan reported that Laurie D. indicated that all classes are going very well. Within the last few weeks, a new family with 4 children have been attending Sunday School classes. Children's Ministry seems to be growing. April 8 will be the Children's Easter Carnival. Everyone is welcome. A good time will be had by all.

Youth Ministry: Cheryl reported that the Youth Ministry is going well. They are in the process of running a number of fund raisers to provide funds to send kids to camp. The financial needs to send kids to camp is \$3982. Currently \$1960 has been raised and \$1200 of this amount has come from the Toilet in the Yard campaign. Everyone is having a very good time with this campaign, plus it is very successful for raising the needed funds. Upcoming Easter Breakfast is another fund raising event that will help the youth raise additional funds for camp. All are encouraged to attend and help our youth. Some discussion thinking about a program that would allow people to participate in "Sponsor a Camper" campaign. Also Youth Ministry has been studying the "Meaning of the Cross" before Easter.

Finance: Scott reported that all bills have been paid YTD. Through the end of February income is down by nearly \$7,000 from a year ago. Pastor Dan indicated that there are ups and downs year by year, and other churches in the area have notice such declines also. Discussion centered around our Stewardship program and placing more emphasis on it moving forward.

Foundation: No Report

Hospitality: Juanita reported all is going well. More people are signing up for refreshments after church services. Juanita also discussed how hospitality is much more than just the refreshments after church services. Hospitality is always looking for ways to expand and serve more families.

Lay Leader: No Report

Mission: Nancy reported that the following results for Mission offerings: January \$589 to Brush with Kindness, February \$357 to Red Bird Mission, March \$200 so far this month for UMCOR, April offerings will be for Praise Fest. Update from Brush of Kindness is that they have scheduled 4 projects so far this year. Also leadership of Brush for Kindness will be changing. Alan Rasmussen was our contact for Brush for Kindness...he will be leaving in the near future, and Wayne Eiler from North Branch will be taking over the coordination.

<u>Publicity and Social Media:</u> Erin is very busy posting all the events we are having. Currently working on the Easter Carnival so we can get a great turnout.

SPRC: Carol Schmidt will be trained in this week on formatting the slides for Sunday services.

<u>Trustees:</u> Lloyd reports that we are currently looking a replacing all the candles behind the altar. There are 7 candles that will cost \$550. If anyone would be interested in buying a candle in memory of a loved one should contact Lloyd. New LED lights have been installed in the cross in the front of the church. They were tested last week and need a little additional work that should be done shortly.

<u>Hope Circle:</u> Everything is going well. There will be no Hope Circle meetings during the summer months.

Women's Bible Study: The group is currently studying the book "24 Hours That Changed The World". This is another book/study by Adam Hamilton. Much interest by all.
