Red Bird Mission in Kentucky our Mission Focus

Kari Collins, Executive Director of Red Bird Mission, Beverly Kentucky:

"A shoot will come up from the stump of Jesse; from his roots a Branch will bear fruit. The Spirit of the Lord will rest on him — He will not judge by what he sees with his eyes, or decide by what he hears with his ears; but with righteousness he will judge the needy, with justice he will give decisions for the poor of the earth." Isaiah 11:1,2, 3b-4a

Jesus still inspires righteous ministry and justice to the poor and needy through Red Bird Mission and Red Bird Clinic on daily basis.

The deaf hear again because audiologists give their time and others give funds to provide hearing aids.

Healing flows from our dental clinic because we have a dentist again and funds are available to provide care for those with desperate dental needs. Thousands of hungry people are fed through our food pantries and meal programs because churches and individuals are donating funds and food that supplement base funding of other organizations. The elderly and children have safe, warm housing because volunteers give of their time and money to make essential home repairs through our Work Camp ministry. Children and youth have opportunity to break the cycle of poverty because generous people support our work to form Christian leaders at Red Bird Christian School.

We praise God for all of these blessings! Even though great ministry is happening here through Red Bird Mission and Red Bird Clinic with the help of our partners, we have seen a decline this year in charitable giving.

If you have given already this year, we are grateful. If you haven't yet given financially this year, please support the ministries that help to bring salvation and life in the name of the Messiah.

From the pastor...

February is upon us. Already the year is moving quickly. I was talking with someone during one of my regular coffee breaks at the Northwoods. He thought February was kind of a blah month. Not much happens; there are no big holidays. I reminded him that there is Presidents Day. Of course, we cannot forget Groundhogs Day, February 2nd. We will be anxiously waiting for word on whether or not the groundhog sees his shadow.

But did you know that February 2nd is also a Christian holiday or holy day? It is known as Candlemas or the Feast of the Presentation of Jesus. This celebration arrives 40 days after Christmas. (There are those traditions that leave Christmas lights up until this day.) On this day we observe the presentation of Jesus in the temple.

We find this story in the second chapter of Luke's Gospel. Joseph and Mary brought Jesus to the temple. The law said that every firstborn male would be designated as holy to the Lord. They offered the required sacrifice: a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons.

There was a man there. His name was Simeon. He was righteous and devout. He was looking forward to the salvation of God. The Holy Spirit had revealed to him that he would not die before he had seen that salvation...before he had seen the Messiah.

Simeon saw Jesus and proclaimed, "Master, now you are dismissing your servant in peace, according to your word; for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the presence of all people, a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel."

I guess what I notice in this is Simeon did not say he had seen the Messiah. He said he had seen God's salvation. Seeing Jesus is seeing God's salvation for all people...all people! Simeon's life was then complete. He was at peace.

So on February 2nd, while the rest of the country nervously waits to see what the groundhog sees, we will pause and look at Jesus. And we will see God's salvation. God's salvation is for us. In Christ we are made complete. In Christ we find peace.

Happy Feast of the Presentation of our Lord Jesus Day.

Old Business: None

Committee Reports:

<u>Adult Ministry</u> – Bible Study on Revelation is going good. Approximate 25 in attendance.

<u>Children's Ministry</u> – Moving to 3 classrooms is working out very well. Commented that the new tables and chairs were very nice for the classrooms. Attendance in all age groups has been very good.

<u>Finance</u> – 2017 budget was presented to the council. MMSP on 2017 budget. 2016 budget seems to have worked well and met all needs. 2017 budget has been reduced by \$3,741.74 from 2016. Committee was confident the 2017 budget should work fine.

Foundation – Last year ending balance was \$153,000. YTD the account is at \$162,000. Discussion that close to 10% of the fund could be used as follows: 5% toward scholarships, and 5% to other worthy activities. For 2017 a new application form has been designed and is now ready for use. New form should be used moving forward. We encourage all to find needed projects and fill out a new form. The new form will be put in newsletter to let all know about it.

<u>Hospitality</u> – Juanita not present, but it sounds like she has been very successful getting others to sign up for Hospitality duty on Sundays.

<u>Missions</u> – Handout distributed for mission in 2016 and 2017. December missions Wycliffe Bible Translators and Gideons will alternate every other year. The July UMC- Reach, Renew, and Rejoice will be the last year this year. Need to find alternative moving forward. Methodist Cemetery Fund was suggested.

<u>Pastor</u> – March 1 begins the next season of Lent with the Ash Wednesday service that evening. March 7-14 Pastor Dan will be gone. Paul Prokosch will be preaching March 12. <u>Publicity and Social Media</u> – Live Nativity drew a huge Facebook following. All other activities are going well.

SPRC - Carol Schmidt will be taking over making the Sunday Slides. She will be training over the next few weeks to become familiar with the process. All employees saw a positive pay adjustment in 2017.

Trustees - No Report

Youth Ministry – Club Rock - Club Rock attendance has been down considerably due to many that have attended are now in high school and have school projects etc. so find it hard to attend. Cheryl continues to work hard at Club Rock and all that attend enjoy. Youth Groups will be studying the 13 most important Bible studies during the year. Last year 11 people attended Summer Camp. Estimated 11 + will be attending in 2017. Fund raisers will used to fund attendance fees for Summer Camp. There is \$475 of funds rolled over from 2016 to help pay for 2017 fees for attendance. The deadline to set up for Summer Camp is April 1 to qualify for a discount. Dates for Summer Camp 2017 will be communicated later.
