From the pastor...

Permit me to state an obvious truth: it was a pretty big deal when Jesus was born. And by big deal, I mean a big deal was made of it. An angel announced his birth. One angel announced the birth to some pretty scared shepherds. Then a bunch of angels appeared. It was a regular heavenly host of angels. They praised God. They proclaimed, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to all on whom God's favor rests." Magi travelled a long distance to see Jesus. They brought gifts. There was a bright light in the sky. Yes...it was a big deal when Jesus was born.

Now for another obvious truth: it was a pretty big deal when Jesus was crucified and then rose from the dead. We acknowledge the resurrection as the key truth for those who follow Jesus. The Apostle Paul wrote, "And if Christ has not been raised, our preaching is useless, and so is your faith...But Christ has indeed been raised from the dead...."

Jesus was raised from the dead. But there was no real big announcement about this. There was no angel announcing an empty tomb. No heavenly host appeared and proclaimed the good news. A couple of angels were at the tomb and quietly explained, "He is not here! He has risen!"

Then Jesus appeared. He appeared to believers. Scripture does not record any appearance by Jesus to unbelievers. He did not go into Jerusalem to show the religious leaders and Roman officials that they could do him no harm. He appeared to his followers. He announced peace to them. He strengthened them. He appeared in more quiet, intimate ways. He appeared to some disciples gathered in a house. He appeared to one woman who was crying in a garden. He walked with two men along a road. He appeared to seven of his followers while they were fishing (they were working). He had a private conversation with one who had denied him.

We follow and serve a risen Savior, and Jesus often appears to us in these quiet ways. He shows up in our homes. He comes to us when we are hurting. He walks beside us along all the roads we take. Jesus comes to the places where we are working. He talks to us. Jesus appears to us in all places and in all circumstances. He lets us know he lives. He gives us strength. He gives us peace. This is a pretty big deal.



HELP began in 2010 with the idea of three men from the community (two from Trinity Lutheran Church and one from First UMC) who saw the need for health equipment to be available to all who may have need of it.

HELP offers used medical equipment to anyone with a temporary need. The equipment can be "borrowed" for up to six months, but can be extended with a phone call for a maximum borrow time of one year. The equipment is housed at First UMC.

The equipment is donated by individuals and health care providers. It is cleaned and sanitized before being issued for use.
