
We took Debbie along for our two days at School Tools. She was a quick learn and a good volunteer.

From the pastor...

The season of Lent is upon us. We will begin this season with an Ash Wednesday service of worship.

When we think of Lent, we often think of denial. This is a season when folks give up something. The question gets asked. "What are you giving up for Lent?" Lent ends with Good Friday. Jesus took up his cross and gave up his life.

Jesus had set his face towards Jerusalem. He knew he was going there to die. He taught his disciples that he would suffer many things and be rejected by the elders, chief priests and teachers of the law. He taught that he would be killed and after three days rise again.

Then he called the crowd to him along with his disciples. He told them that if any wanted to go to Jerusalem with him, they had to deny themselves and take up their own cross, and follow him. He then added, "For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it."

This is the invitation of Lent. We deny ourselves. Jesus is our example. As Paul said, Jesus was equal with God, but did not take advantage of that equality. Jesus emptied himself and took on the form of a servant. He was obedient to the point of death. He gave up his life. And so we take up our own cross. We follow Jesus.

What does it mean to follow someone? It means we walk the same path they walked. We follow in their steps. We follow Jesus all the way. As the old hymn says, "I can hear my Savior calling..., 'Take thy cross and follow, follow me.' Where he leads me I will follow; I'll go with him, with him all the way."

This Lent listen for Jesus calling and inviting us to follow him...to walk the same path he walked. In this we will find life.

Defibrillator



Church Council Minutes/January 15, 2015

Meeting opened with prayer.

Old Business: MMSP to approve minutes from 11/20/14 meeting.

Committee Reports:

Finance - All bills from 2014 have been paid, with 1K remaining in the account. Only one apportionment payment was made in 2014. Pledges for 2015 are essentially the same as pledges were for 2014. Heating expense for 2015 is an area of concern, with the hope that this winter is not as expensive as last winter. Approval of 2015 budget is forthcoming.

Missions - December's offering of \$512 went to Wycliffe. First United Methodist had nine persons who rang bells at Lindstrom Foods on December 6th. The Christmas Eve service offering was divided with half for Family Pathways and half for the Pastor's Discretionary Fund, \$457 for each. Mission Sunday offerings designations for 2015 will be essentially the same as in past years. Question arose: Would a Missions booth at Praise Fest be an outreach opportunity?

SPRC - No report

Lay Leader - No report

Foundation - Year end balance is approximately 57K. Notification has been received from the MN Conference indicating that a check designated for the Foundation should arrive this week. As yet the monetary amount is unknown.

Trustees - The committee will be meeting next week. Heat update: Work has been done on the heating and the zones should now be balanced; valves were overhauled, and air removed from the lines (no more noise). Of the three pumps, we are using two, which should result in a cost savings. Last month the gas expense was down and the electric expense increased why needs to be determined.

Long Range Planning - No report

Worship - The focus (The Journey) during Advent was very positive and well received.

Church Council Minutes continued...

The Live Nativity was attended by 650-700. Christmas Eve service was attended by 204, an increase of 40 from last year. Upcoming: Ash Wednesday, March 18th and Easter, April 5th.

Staff Reports:

Children - Consistently averaging six per Sunday, with middle school two to four. The goal is to study and learn the Ten Commandments and then share with the congregation.

Youth - Club Rock continues to host around fourteen kids. December 18th Club Rock had a party and viewed a movie. The Christmas cookie project raised about \$300 which may be used toward a youth camping opportunity. The Italian dinner to be hosted and served by the youth will be held on Saturday, March 21st. Looking ahead for 2015 and 2016, the intent is to form a team and develop more youth activities and opportunities.

Adult Ministry - Pastor will be gone the first Sunday in February - communion will therefore be held the second Sunday. **Paul Prokosch** will be preaching and **Cheryl Lecy** helping with worship. The third Sunday in February Pastor will be involved with the prison ministry, and **Chris Anderson** will be preaching. Ten people representing five couples will be joining our church the last Sunday in February. We hope to have special fellowship following the service, and perhaps a new member photo board.

Special Groups:

Hospitality - Hope Circle continues to be active with 12-16 persons sharing social and spiritual time. An extension of the service continues each Sunday with our fellowship and coffee time. Discussion ensued about forming a committee dedicated to the hospitality function, encouraging organized participation as desired and needed for hospitality endeavors, as hospitality need not be the sole responsibility of Hope Circle. Wants and needs in this area - more bodies.

Women's Bible Study/Cindy Kopp - Will commence, after a brief respite, on Tuesday, February 10th, from 9:15-11:00; typically attended by 9-12 people.

Women's Evening Bible Study/Cheryl Lecy -

Thursday's 7:00-9:00. Concluded the Susie Larson study; a new topic forthcoming.

Wednesday Evening Bible Study/Pastor Dan -

Regularly 15-20 attending.

• **Family Praise Fest** - Hope is to have more people from the community involved, possibly a 12 person board of judges for the barbecue contest? Family Feud competition with other churches?

• **Hootenanny** - This year's theme in September will be "Broadway".

• Youth/Children Harvest Festival

• **Carpet Project** - Dollars continue to trickle in; Sanctuary Design Team may have recommendations to share.
