Mission Focus this month for YWAM ~ Erik & Ele Brohaugh

YWAM (Youth With A Mission)-

Erik & Ele live among a minority tribal people group in West Africa.

They work towards seeing a multiplying, indigenous church established there. There are about 100 believers within the 2 million strong people group. The rest adhere to Islam officially, but daily lives is very much a mix of that with the animistic beliefs that preceded their conversion to Islam- so best described as "folk Islam". Erik & Ele look for every opportunity to share personal testimony and scripture with the people around them to lead them towards an understanding of Jesus.

They do this in the context of community development projects. Erik works with the men and government in tackling the local erosion problem. He also has a tree nursery and works with and encourages villagers to plant trees in the deforested land which he also farms. He has a welding and fabricating workshop and works with a number of young men there on tree protectors and other village projects. He continues to promote earth blocks five

years on from the construction of their house by making and maintaining presses and training block makers.

Ele has the huge task of schooling their kids! She also takes care of them (and Erik) in many ways including cooking a nutritious evening meal to supplement the local meals. She spends time with the women and lovingly looks after the cuts and sores of the 20+ children of the extended family that she has lived with for more than 16 years.

Their children **Asaph**, **Anna and Khara** are linguistic geniuses and a big asset to the ministry.

Erik grew up in Lindstrom as part of 1st UMC and met Ele, who is from England, working in the village where they still live while he was doing a training school with YWAM in 2002.

From the pastor...

When Life Speaks for Itself

In a hospital room at the Mpls VA Medical Center, in April 2005, my dad planned his own funeral. My mother, three older brothers, and I, were there with him. What he felt most strongly about was that none of us were to speak at the service. "My life speaks for itself" Dad said.

We honored Dad's wishes and didn't speak about him at his funeral. It was beautiful service of music and scripture and Word preached that captured and honored who he was. Especially, with him being a drummer in a big band (The Blue Banners), it was moving to end the service with a rousing version of "Oh When the Saints Go Marching In!"

Well, Dad never said I couldn't *write* about him. So here are special thoughts and memories that come to mind as I think about Jesus' call and challenge to us to witness and testify to the ways He works daily in our lives.

The night of Dad's visitation was a gift to me. He had been a new and used car salesman for thirty years. As 300 people came and went that night I heard stories about Dad I had never heard before. Each story a gift. They were stories about how Dad had ministered to those telling the story, though they didn't use the word "minister", and my Dad wouldn't have thought that he was ministering. However, as a pastor hearing these stories, I heard in every one, examples of transformation, acceptance, love, forgiveness, and blessing that Dad had given them. Both unaware that ministry had occurred. A glorious and Godly exchange would took place between my Dad and those he encountered – whether on the car lot, the local café, the fishing hole, the nursing home, at church, at family gatherings, or wherever – it didn't matter – God was a part of my Dad – everyone who met him knew that. Dad loved God. Dad lived his life. Ministry happened.

When the visitation ended, my family and I were exhausted. Yet, I was convinced, Dad was right. His life did speak for itself. There was no doubt about that. The voice of Dad's life had spoken and I, or any of my brothers, didn't have to say a word. There isn't anything we could have said that would have added to the voice of Dad's life.

Think about that with me, for a moment. What happens when your life speaks? How does it change you? How does it change the people you encounter on a daily basis? Does your life positively or negatively impact the lives of those you meet? In what ways? What is your unspoken witness? What is your silent testimony?

As followers and disciples of Jesus Christ, shouldn't it be our primary goal in life to live our faith in all that we do whether at work, at home, or at play? Where does it say that we should act one way at church and act another way at work or at home? When we love God; when we worship God; when we follow God; when we serve God; and when we believe in God, our lives should reflect that, at all times and in all places.

Has your life spoken? What does the voice of your life say? How has it transformed others? How has it accepted others? How has it loved others? How has it forgiven others? How has it blessed others? In what ways do you allow your faith in Jesus to dictate your behavior from day to day?

Please understand, my Dad wasn't perfect. He wasn't a saint. He was just like you and me in many ways. He loved his family. He loved his friends. He loved life. He loved Jesus. And everyone knew it.

Well Dad would think I've written too much, so I'll end with this — when we love Jesus, and when life speaks for itself, lives our changed. Yours, as well as those you'll know and meet.

St. Francis of Assisi said this: "Preach the Gospel at all times – if necessary, use words."

Love God. Live your life. Live out loud! Ministry will happen.
